

Mayville

Mayville is a section of Bethel that was settled by members of the Twitchell, Chapman and Mason families. Located on the north and northwest side of the Androscoggin River, the name Mayville first began appearing in Oxford County newspapers around 1868. For the 100 years after its first settler, Eli Twitchell, arrived Mayville was almost entirely a farming area. After arrival of the railroad and construction of the large covered bridge connecting Bethel's village center with the north side of the river, accommodations for summer vacationers appeared. The photo below shows Mayville as it is today. What you see is what there is.
